Pentecost – Youth Mission Trip

This weekend we celebrate the feast of Pentecost. Pentecost marks the close of the Easter Season. Pentecost commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles. Up until this time, the Apostles had been hiding in the upper room for fear of the Jews. They were afraid that they would suffer the same type of death that Jesus had suffered. It was through the gift of the Holy Spirit that the Apostles would finally have the courage to go out and begin to form the early Church. Once they received the Holy Spirit, they had the courage to go out and to speak of Christ. More importantly, they had the courage to live as Christ taught them to live, to love as Christ taught them to love. Christ tells us that He revealed Himself, revealed God to us so that His joy may be complete and that His joy might be in us. The disciples, filled with joy, filled with the love of God went out and formed the Church. Thousands were added to their number daily. The Church is born, the Church is given its mission, become the Body of Christ, become Christ for the world.

This weekend, many of our youth will be going on the annual mission trip. They leave for Milwaukee on Saturday evening. Each year they learn what it means to be “Church”, what it means to live Pentecost. They learn how to be the Body of Christ in some way, shape or form. It may be in picking up a paint brush and giving a new coat of paint to a home. It may be in picking up a cloth and cleaning up someone else’s mess. It may be picking up rubbish that has accumulated over time. It may be in running an errand to the store so others may continue to work, or others may eat. It may be in doing paperwork so others may help. Our youth will learn that there are many ways of being “Church” for others. As the Body of Christ, we try to do what is needed, when it is needed. We are filled with joy because we participate in that Body of Christ. This week we pray for our youth in a special way. We pray that they may not only feel the urgings of the Spirit, but that they will realize the joy that comes from living their faith and bringing Christ to others. We are proud of all of you.
