Virtue of Modesty?

'Tis' the season for the great outdoors. Everyone is busy. Parents and kids get busy with sports and activities, it is easy to throw whatever on and head out the door. Unfortunately, some of the clothes we throw on are not appropriate for all occasions. I don't want people not coming to church because they are caught out in casual clothes or they did not get back in time to make it home to change, but we do need to be cognizant of the message we send. What we wear often sets the mood for the importance of the event we are attending. A couple questions that are always good to ask; Am I wearing something that may distract others? Does what I am wearing show the respect due or the nature of where I am going? I think if we ask ourselves these questions, we won't have others asking; Can you believe what they are wearing? I wouldn't be caught dead in that! Of course, the above comes from someone who has a wardrobe selection of black, black and more black. Have a great summer!

Modesty

I mentioned above the virtue of modesty. I mentioned it regarding the way we dress, in particular, the way we dress as we come to church. Our dress often reflects the regard we hold for the event that we are attending. Today, I mention modesty in a bit of a different way and that is modesty in our speech. I am often shocked by what I read people talking about on social media. I wonder why people say or reveal things about themselves or others. I don't know if it is pride, or attempts to look important or popular, but we need to consider what we are revealing about not only ourselves but also about others. Many times, we infringe on other's privacy or maybe even bring harm to their good name or reputation. We need to consider if others really need to know everything about us or everything about what we do or whom we do things with. In the past we considered whether we were just "putting on airs." We may need to ask ourselves if we do that with social media today. What we say on social media is in the public eye or scrutiny forever. May be good to learn to be modest in our speech.
